The Golden Mile

On Monday we will be launching a new initiative called The Golden Mile. This is in conjunction with a programme that Active Essex are running and the idea behind it is to encourage the children to be healthier. Also taking regular daily exercise will help with concentration. Many schools in our area are already involved and they have shared lots of positive success stories.

We will initially have the Golden Mile during the mornings on Mondays, Thursdays and Fridays. After Easter we will also have the mile on Tuesdays too. To begin with we will just walk but hopefully as we build up stamina, some children may decide that they want to run the Golden Mile. The Golden Mile equates to 5 laps of the school.

All children from Year 1-Year 6 will need to have a pair of trainers in school and a coat appropriate for the weather on the day. We will take part in the Golden Mile come rain or shine.

Our Reception children won't take part until the summer term.

Whole School Trips
