# **School Uniform**

#### Girls

# **Boys**

White logoed shirt with grey school shorts/ trousers.

If your child is wearing only their white polo shirt and not their jumper please make sure that it has the school logo on it

It was really sad to learn this week that the 80s disco had to be cancelled due to lack of support.
