## Summer Uniform

### Girls

White or blue gingham blouse

### Or

White Polo shirt with school logo  
Navy Blue School cardigan or jumper  
Grey or navy school skirt/ pinafore/  
shorts

### Or

Gingham dress/ all in one/ two piece  
White socks or grey/ navy tights  
**FLAT** Black School shoes or Navy closed in sandals  
(No open toed shoes, Crocs or bright coloured sandals or trainers please)  
Blue or white **small** hair accessories

### Boys

White school shirt

### Or

White Polo shirt with school logo  
Navy Blue School jumper or fleece  
Grey or black school trousers/ shorts  
Black School shoes or navy sandals  
(No open toed shoes, Crocs or trainers please)

We would also ask that children do not wear any make up or nail varnish to school.

Jewellery should be a small wristwatch (no apple watches please) and small, plain stud earrings. No bracelets or necklaces please.

## The Station
