Aims

At Great Bardfield Primary school we want our children to be active, fit and healthy. We believe that all children should take part in physical activity every day and strive to provide as many opportunities for this as possible within the school day. Following Government guidance, schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that schools should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
